#### **2018 NAPLAN Results**

We are very proud to share our school's results for this year's NAPLAN testing. As you can see from the data below, most results are higher than state mean results in Year 3. Our Year 5 results are similarly pleasing, although below state mean, the growth from year 3 to 5 in Reading, Writing and Numeracy are higher than the state growth. Our focus over the last several years has been to implement structures that continue to personalise and differentiate the learning for every single student at Tootgarook. The school is almost one year through its current Strategic Plan and will analyse these results, along with other data sets, as part of our ongoing improvement journey. Individual student reports for students in Years 3 and 5 who sat this year's NAPLAN tests can be picked up from the school office as of tomorrow (Friday). For any parents who would like further assistance with interpreting their child's NAPLAN results, support documentation can be accessed at www.vcaa..vic.edu.au by following the 'Parents' option from the NAPLAN menu. I once again commend the ongoing efforts of our fabulous teaching staff to ensure that each student at Tootgarook is deeply engaged in their learning and genuinely supported in their aspirations to achieve highly.

On Wednesday the "Turn the Tide" Tootstars group jumped on a bus to Phillip Island to learn about

the natural environment, wildlife and the diversity of the Island. The



students had the opportunity to touch a variety of taxidermied animals including an echidna, a seal pup, a possum, a little penguin and a short tailed shearwater. We were educated about what to do if we come across injured animals and the dangers of marine debris.



We were lucky enough to see a few wild little penguins in manmade nests and many Cape Barren Geese!

After a lunch break we met Kim (the Parks Leader) at the Nobbies.

Here we had the opportunity to explore the education centre and find information about certain animals which was then followed up by a quick quiz. The students enjoyed the chill zone and cuddling animated penguins and seals. A quick walk along the boardwalk lead us to a secret cave and the blow hole with some outstanding views! We also were able to spot some natural penguin burrows and the tracks they use to come up the cliff faces.

If you are unsure as to your eligibility or you have not yet registered your details please contact Centrelink direct on 136 150.
- Eastbourne Primary School has an EFTPOS facility, phone payments or direct payment into the school's bank account for any parents who wish to use this method of payment.
