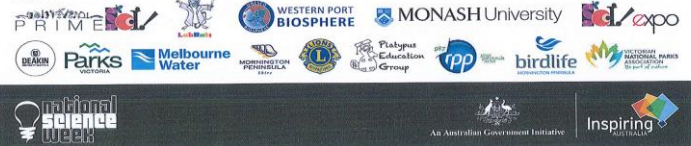

Would you like to gain a TAFE qualification at Chisholm Institute and be assisted with all the fees? An SMP Connect scholarship covers all training costs plus approved out-of-pocket expenses not met by a person's entitlements through Centrelink. Age is no barrier for those who wish to return to education after a long absence with some of the current SMP Connect students being over 45 years. More than 70% of the scholarship students are females and 55% are over 21 years. Many who have obtained a qualification have entered the workforce as an employee or set up their own business. A large number of the adult students have told us of the positive effect in the household with the family being very proud of their achievement.
