


Photo envelopes with your child's name on it were sent home last week and need to be returned together with payment on <u>Tuesday 28th March</u>.

St John Ambulance will visit our school tomorrow to deliver free First Aid in Schools training to our students.



Through the First Aid in Schools program, trained St John presenters lead students from Gr 1 – Gr 6 through tailored sessions on the importance of First Aid and what to do in the event of an emergency. Our junior students learn about how to identify when there is an emergency, keeping themselves safe, and how to call for an ambulance. Senior students learn about delivering CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and the things they can do to assist in an emergency. Participating students will be given a special piece of homework for parents to

EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day - missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early—a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day—even in the early wares of primmy school. the early years of primary school.

"Day off" - Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall

Truancy - This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
