


## BOOKFAIR

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### EASTBOURNE VACATION CARE PROGRAM

**Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2017 to Friday 14<sup>th</sup>  
July 2017**

Eastbourne Primary School will conduct a Vacation Care Service during the forthcoming school holidays. If you would like to enrol your children in the Holiday Program – please take note of the following:-

1. Bookings will be taken until **Friday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2017**.
2. **Cost is \$50.00 per child per day inclusive.** If you are eligible for a Centre-Link Child Care Rebate, this will continue to apply. As has been the case in the past, once the relevant calculations have been done taking your Centrelink rebate into account, you will only need to pay the balance owing. If you do not currently receive a Centrelink Childcare Rebate and are unsure as to your eligibility – please contact Centrelink direct on 136 150.
3. Eastbourne Primary School has an EFTPOS facility, phone payments or direct payment into the school's bank account for any parents who wish to use this method of payment.
4. **Activities include excursion to Sorrento Cinema and Park and Mornington Inflatable World and lots more.**

### ATTENTION HEALTH CARE CARD OR PENSION CARD HOLDERS

The Department of Education + Training again this year offering the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund of \$125 per child which is to be used towards school camps, sports and excursions.

**CSEF** eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pension Card being eligible on **30<sup>th</sup> January** and successfully validated with Centrelink.
