Fond Farewell from Mrs Parsons



23rd of September: School Holidays! Yay! (Yes, I know that's not an environmental event, but it's exciting ①)

Aussie Backyard Bird Count!!!

Each year people from all around Australia go to their favourite outdoor space and take part in the Aussie backyard Bird Count! To get involved all you need is to register online and download the app, then enter all the birds and bird species you see. On the app is a bird identifier to help with the species you don't know, so you don't have to be a bird expert! All this information will be processed to see how Aussie birds are going, so you'll be able to see the results from each state and Australia wide at the end. Last year, 61418 people participated and they counted 1,403,788 birds. The more birds the better!
