2019 NAPLAN Results

We begin this week's newsletter with a snapshot of our school's results in this year's national testing program (NAPLAN). We have always had a very transparent approach to the sharing of this information each year, as part of our school's continuous improvement journey.

In summary, the Year 5 data is above the state mean in most areas whilst the Year 3 data is more varied. In recognising how capable and dedicated our teachers are at Tootgarook, you can be assured that these results have raised a variety of questions for the school in regards to the durability of our programs from year to year, as well as the school's provision for the increasingly complex needs of some of our student cohorts. Our school targets for 2019 in most areas have been achieved, inclusive of the growth of students between tears 3 and 5. Students who participated in this year's NAPLAN testing will receive their individual reports by the middle of next week. It is important that this information is considered alongside the comprehensive student achievement data provided through the school and Student Reports.

Pasta Frittatas

Ingredients

1 cup mini penne pasta 6 eggs

1/2 cup milk 3/4 cup (180g) semi-dried tomatoes, roughly chopped

150g shaved ham, finely chopped 1 cup grated tasty cheese

2 tablespoons finely chopped chives 300g jar chunky tomato salsa

Oven-baked fries, to serve



Method

- Step 1 Preheat oven to 180C. Grease a 6-hole, 3/4-cup capacity Texas muffin pan. Line muffin hole bases with baking paper.
- Step 2 Cook pasta in a large saucepan of boiling salted water, following packet directions, until just tender. Ask an adult to drain pasta. Transfer to a large bowl. Allow to cool for 10 minutes. Using a fork, beat eggs and milk in a jug. Pour over pasta.
- Step 3 Add semi-dried tomato, ham, cheese and chives to pasta mixture. Stir until well combined. Season with salt and pepper.
- Step 4 Carefully fill muffin holes with pasta mixture. Bake for 30 minutes or until frittatas are puffed and golden. Stand for 5 minutes. Turn out onto a wire rack. Serve frittatas with a dollop of tomato salsa and salad.

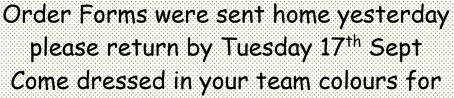

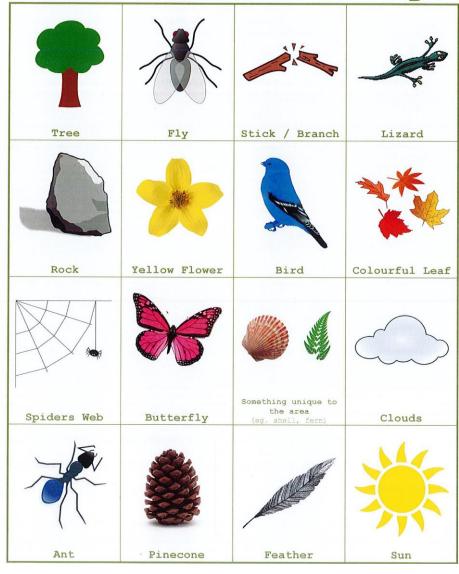

- Cost is \$55.00 per child per day. With the introduction of the new Child Care Subsidy it is vital that all families have registered with Centrelink and have a copy of your new approved hours and percentage. If your approved hours are more than the number of hours you require you will be charged the full amount of \$55.00 for any additional hours. If you are unsure as to your eligibility or you have not yet registered your details please contact Centrelink direct on 136 150.
- 2. Eastbourne Primary School has an EFTPOS facility, phone payments or direct payment into the school's bank account for any parents who wish to use this method of payment.
